

AMTA Virtual Auditions Guidelines

AMTA virtual auditions are designed to be a flexible alternative to physical district auditions if a student has a conflict. There is no geographic restriction for the district and all three levels (Bronze, Silver, and Gold) are welcome to enter. The format will be similar to virtual submissions in the past, but here is an overview:

- Two videos will be required, one for the audition pieces and one for theory (if Silver or Gold).
- This will be for the district level only; there will be no virtual auditions at the state level. Video submissions for the district auditions must be submitted through Tenuto.
- Theory requirements will be sent out the day before the video submission due date. Just like in the live auditions, theory must be performed without reference materials and the spelling of chords and intervals must be done out loud.
- Students must upload their videos to YouTube and submit the link to Tenuto.
- Videos should be "unlisted," and the title should preferably read: AMTA District Audition (Name of Student). Videos should not be marked as "Made for Kids."
- The piano pieces must be announced either in the video or in the video description, including the key and opus number.
- The student's face, head, hands, and feet must be visible in video.
- We do request for scores to be uploaded if possible in PDF format to help the judges in giving their feedback
